The South Cobb High School Class of 1966 held its 50-Year Reunion with an attendance of more than 80 class members and 121 attendees. A special tribute was given to the veterans in the class by classmate Retired Brigadier General Steve Blanton. Forty-one classmates have served and three classmates lost their lives in the Vietnam War. The class' 35-Year Reunion was held at the Governor's Mansion and hosted by then-governor at the time, Roy Barnes, who was also a 1966 class member.

The Bullock Hope House is a 501c3 foundation organized in 2005 by 1966 classmate Connie Bullock and her husband, Randall Bullock, who is also a graduate of South Cobb High School Class of 1964. The home was dedicated to host out-of-town patients and their caregivers while undergoing treatments at local metro hospitals, free of charge. The Bullock Hope House has proudly been partnered with WellStar Health Systems since its inception and most recently created a partnership with the WellStar Cobb Hospital Burn Center.
